EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

BOARD ACTION REQUESTED

Re-Adopt Resolution No. 6735

ACTION SUMMARY

At the September 9, 2009, the action was adopted with three affirmative votes which moved its effective date out thirty days. This action will re-adopt Resolution No. 6735 in order for the effective date to be "immediately upon its adoption."

The Resolution authorizes PDC Executive Director to enter into a Grant Agreement with REACH Community Development to provide \$125,000 in TIF funds for the REACH Community Builders Program in the Lents Town Center Urban Renewal Area, which provides home repairs to low-income and disabled seniors. This action will ensure continuation of this successful program for Fiscal Year 2009-10 so that REACH may meet more of the demand for home repairs from qualified homeowners in Lents.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

PDC's support to the REACH Community Builders Program is highly leveraged by private donations of home repair materials and services, as well as volunteer time and community involvement in support of urban renewal and neighborhood revitalization goals in Lents. The funding will help accomplish repairs for 60 homeowners in Lents Town Center Urban Renewal Area, including substantial external home improvements such as painting and debris removal through the annual REACH Paint & Repair-a-thon.

The home repairs are essential in providing housing stability for aging and disabled low income homeowners, many of whom have lived in the neighborhood for decades.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AND FEEDBACK

The REACH Community Builders Program has been reviewed and supported by the Lents Town Center URAC every year as part of the PDC's overall work in Lents. The idea of supporting existing homeowners and providing physical improvements to single family homes has been very popular.

COMPLIANCE WITH ADOPTED PLANS AND POLICIES

The REACH Community Builders Program was identified as meeting a specific need in the Lents area for minor health, safety, and appearance repairs to homes of low income and disabled senior homeowners. It complements the PDC Home Repair Loan and renovation mortgage programs by meeting a need that these programs do not, allowing PDC to assist a broader spectrum of residents in Lents in a very cost-effective way.

The Community Builders Program's work in the Lents Town Center Urban Renewal Area is an important contributor to the revitalization of the urban renewal area according to the adopted 1999 *Lents Town Center Urban Renewal Plan*:

"Help provide new and rehabilitated housing units suitable for households with a range of incomes and housing needs, recognizing the value of the existing affordable housing stock. Create housing opportunities that allow Lents residents of all ages and income levels to remain in the community...help rehabilitate existing housing in residential neighborhoods through financial assistance, technical assistance, and other methods."

It is also consistent with the 2000 Lents Town Center Urban Renewal Area Housing Strategy and the 2006 Lents Town Center Urban Renewal Area Housing Study Update, which illustrates that homeownership rate for senior citizens in Lents is very high, and many of these seniors have very low incomes and/or are disabled and unable to repair their homes as needed.

This funding meets the income guidelines and is "counted" as part of the TIF Set Aside. It serves homeowners earning as little as 0-30% MFI, up to 50% MFI.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Lents Town Center Urban Renewal Area adopted Fiscal Year 2009/10 budget allocates \$125,000 for this program.

RISK ASSESSMENT

No significant risks identified.

WORK LOAD IMPACT

Project management of the Grant Agreement is currently in the Department Work Plan for the Housing Policy, Planning and Development team.

ALTERNATIVE ACTIONS

"No action/non-approval." Commission may choose not to provide funding for this program.

CONCURRENCE

The Portland Housing Bureau (PHB, formerly BHCD) also funds the REACH Community Builders Program for their citywide (outside of Lents) work. PDC staff has communicated with PHB to ensure both agencies support continued funding of the program and REACH's performance has been satisfactory.

BACKGROUND

PDC has provided funds to this program since 1999 for a total of \$972,088, most recently through a Grant Agreement approved by the Board in 2007 (Resolution 6485). REACH Community Builders Program has met contractual obligations and has repaired 481 homes to-date in the Lents Town Center Urban Renewal Area. REACH submits regular quarterly reports on its work and meets other milestones and deliverables as detailed in the Scope of Work for this funding.

Because the previous resolution (6489, approved June 14, 2007) authorized only two years of grant funding, the Board must authorize additional funding for this program starting in the 2009/10 FY.

This program complements other PDC housing programs and development in the Lents URA, as PDC aims to provide housing opportunities for a wide variety of needs and income levels. PDC and REACH cross-market each others' homeownership and home repair programs in Lents at community events and through referrals, and in some publications. When REACH is working with a homeowner who needs more extensive home repairs, they refer them to the PDC Home Repair Loan and other resources.

REACH Community Builders is the organizer of the annual Paint and Repair-a-thon event, which has provided more significant house painting, external repairs, and debris clean-up for homes in Lents and citywide for 15 years. PDC is a partner in this event. In 2008, REACH volunteers painted their 200th home, which was in the Lents Town Center URA. For the 2009 event, all 22 homes painted and repaired in one day were in the Lents Town Center URA.
