  - Examples of TIF funded affordable housing projects
  - Overview of housing production and policy

# **Exploration Overview & District Priorities**

- Sarah Harpole (Prosper Portland) provided overview of TIF exploration process starting with the City Council direction for the three Central City TIF districts.
- Helmi presented on the Central City Investment Priorities and the fixed percent that is allocated for affordable housing, which is under Portland Housing Bureau's purview. Economic and urban development, and infrastructure falls under Prosper Portland's scope.
  - Question: Does every action plan need to have the same percentage allocations as the TIF plan?
  - o *Response*: Action Plans do not have a set amount that must be met every five years so long as the action plans are within the amount allocated in the district plan.
  - Helmi highlighted the set-aside fund and affordable housing policies.
- Sarah highlighted each TIF district with its priorities and community interest/feedback
  - Question: How will you know what opportunities are out there that could use TIF funding? Green Loop for example.
  - Response to question: A Technical Advisory Committee comprised of City Bureau staff will be convened and can provide insight to planned capital improvements and other project plans. The Green Loop is an example that crosses all three new TIF districts.
- Small Group Break Out Discussion: 10 minutes for Working Groups to split into district specific conversations to ask questions and share observations about their district.

## **Introduction to Action Planning**

- Kiana presented on action planning purpose. The long-term outcomes and priorities comes from the TIF District Plan and near term outcomes and priorities will be outlined in the Action Plan. Once the Action Plan is approved by each Working Group, the Prosper Portland Board of Commissioners, and Portland City Council, it is up Prosper Portland and Portland Housing Bureau to implement and report on outcomes.
