Affordable Housing Set-Aside Policy

- Increase aggregate minimum TIF Set Aside for Affordable Housing from 30% to 45%
- Retain existing income guidelines

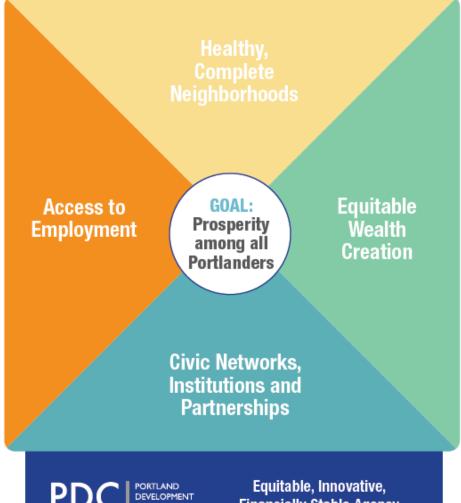

- Partner with individual long-term property owners to move forward development work
- Expand inclusive entrepreneurship initiatives and access to capital
