TIF Exploration in Context

- Community advocacy and engagement
- Advance Portland and State of Housing Report identifying community, economic, and market conditions
- Tax increment financing as a source of geographically focused funding to support stabilization and inclusive growth
- City Council direction supporting up to 7,500 acres and up to \$6 billion in assessed value for TIF exploration
- City Council allocation of resources to explore creation of up to three districts
- Under the leadership of Commissioner Carmen Rubio, Prosper Portland and PHB launch the exploration process







Steering Committee & Working Groups

Steering Committee Role

- Advise on, and review **engagement processes** for exploration
- Allocate available acreage and assessed value across as many as three districts in East Portland, inclusive of the area surrounding 82nd Avenue
- Provide guidance to Working Groups on issues that arise which have **implications across districts** and/or for the broader East Portland geography
- Support community-led Working Groups conducting exploration processes in each of those defined areas
- Ensure any TIF District Plans resulting from exploration align with prior City Council guidance






Steering Committee Work to Date

- 1) Established exploration areas based on initial maps
- 2) Set allocation of acreage/assessed value per geographically specific working group (WGs)
- 3) Gave guidance on plans, data, and engagement recommendations/starting points for WGs






Exploration Areas for Working Group Formation, Consideration



Working Group(s) Role


- Lead **deep dive community district exploration** conversations

 Steering Committee for additional guidance





Values, Vision & Goals: Examples from East Portland Community Plans & the Cully TIF Plan





We envision communities that are safe, supportive, and full of opportunity.



BLACK I AM THE PEOPLE'S PLAN

Black Portlanders want and need to be reflected in our city and to have the sacredness of our history and culture recognized.

The district features **safe, walk-able areas** rich with many different **cultural establishments** serving food & drink, arts, entertainment and gathering places that foster a **sense of ethnic diversity**.

The neighborhood is identified as a **distinct regional cultural district** using consistent signage, lighting, calming traffic, physical improvements and signature events focusing on our many different cultures.





Neighbors want to feel accepted, welcome and safe in their community.

Neighbors want to see **positive**, **healthy businesses and amenities** that are **easily accessible**.

Neighbors want **affordability**, in housing and in life.

Neighbors want a **spectrum of services** that will help them improve their lives.





In our future, one's household income, immigrant status, country of origin, or primary spoken language has no bearing on one's ability to launch or grow a business, or access and achieve education and career goals.

In our future, long-standing residents and businesses **eagerly** welcome newcomers.





Our goal is to **empower East Portland communities** to construct a proactive economic prosperity and neighborhood revitalization strategy designed to **avoid the displacement which typically occurs when neighborhoods prosper**.





Our goal is to increase the number of community partnerships to:

Increase the number and diversity of people involved in their community;
 Strengthen community capacity to engage civically and;
 Increase community impact on public decision-making





The community's long-term **VISION** is to transform Cully into a place that provides a sense of belonging for its residents, particularly for Priority **Communities.** This means Cully will have plentiful safe, affordable housing, thriving Black-, Indigenous-, and People of Color (BIPOC)-owned businesses, rewarding employment opportunities, safe and accessible transportation options, parks and open spaces, a clean and healthy environment, climate resiliency, with places and programs that reflect the cultural diversity of **BIPOC** individuals.
