- vv. *Comment:* Safer walk/roll options for accessing Parkrose commercial area, industrial area for access to jobs
- ww. Comment: Explore community solar
- xx. Comment: Find space for a library
- yy. Comment: affordable "one-stop-shop" type business (kmart type stores)
- zz. Comment: More food options for students around the school
- aaa. Comment: More things for young people to do at the park
- 5. Roger moved the committee into a conversation around infrastructure TIF eligible projects.
 - a. Priority for TIF funding:
 - i. Comment: Building village of Parkrose explore building plaza behind businesses, sidewalk and roads built between Wygant and Sandy Blvd more beacon crossing
 - ii. *Comment*: Related to previous board, improving the workforce connection between residential and business areas
 - iii. Comment: Pedestrian lighting
 - iv. *Comment:* Change development orientation away from Sandy Blvd so it feels safe and welcoming
 - v. Comment: Look at Tillamook rerouting the highway as an example
 - vi. Comment: Improve access to commercial corridor
 - b. For discussion:
 - i. *Comment*: Purchase land for parks TIF funds used to set aside land but PPR funds development of land
 - ii. Comment: Neighborhood parks, not parks that kids have to drive to
 - iii. Comment: Safety improvements for NW 122nd where students cross streets

- iv. *Comment:* Build walk and roll interconnectivity between the industrial and residential areas (or is this done through federal connecting communities grants?)
- v. Comment: Matching funds to enhance safe route funding for sidewalks
- vi. *Comment:* Sidewalks are needed but there are opportunities to use other funding sources matched with TIF
- vii. Comment: Slough access
- viii. *Comment:* Anything that brings people together and makes it easier for people to get around the neighborhood
- c. Not a priority for TIF funding:
 - i. *Comment:* Stormwater drainage improvements
 - ii. Comment: Improvements to current park facilities
