
Meetings will be conducted to foster collaborative decisionmaking using either:

- Robert's Rules of Order culminating in a majority vote;
- Consensus Decision Making (including Modified Consensus Decision Making). This still requires a quorum and a final vote.



Robert's Rules of Order




Consensus Decision Making

You can also use... **Modified Consensus Decision Making** Consensus Consensus Minus Two **Minus One**




Fist to Five Voting



- simple consensus: anyone who voted a 0 or 1 shares their objections and possible solutions are brainstormed to better fit their needs, and then if there are no vetoes the proposal is passed
- alignment: the proposal is passed only when all votes are over 3 or 4 (i.e. everyone is in complete affirmative agreement)
- *majority*: count all 3-5 votes as "yes" and all 0-2 votes as "no", then majority wins
